## Timepieces that won't break the bank

### Egyptian Mythology

Originally known as the Scorpion Watch Company, Serket (from the deification of the scorpion in Egyptian mythology) has come up with its second version of its initial Scorpion Reef Diver watch. The Serket Reef Diver 2.0 has a stainless steel brushed and polished case and a 120-click unidirectional elapsed-time bezel that measures 47 mm in diameter (57 mm when counting the lugs). The dial has Swiss Tritec SuperLuminova markers and hands. A 4 mm thick sapphire crystal sits on the front, and another 2 mm thick orange mineral crystal allows a view of the Sellita SW 200 26-jewel automatic movement on the back. This Swiss-made diver's watch, water resistant to 300 meters, comes in a limited edition of 200, with either a black leather strap with orange stitching or a black Italian rubber diver's strap, both with a brushed stainless steel buckle with Serket engraving. Retail price: \$999.
